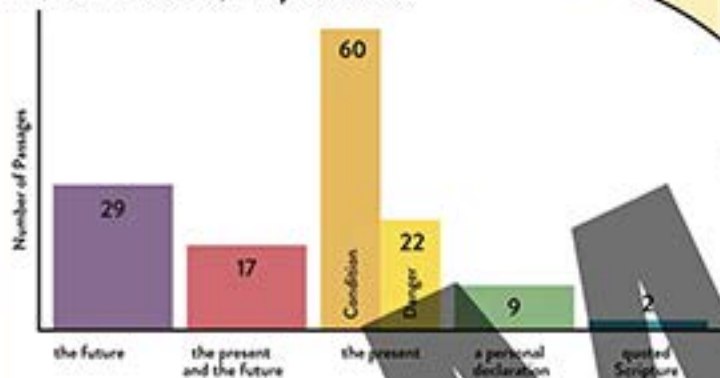


DO NOT FEAR

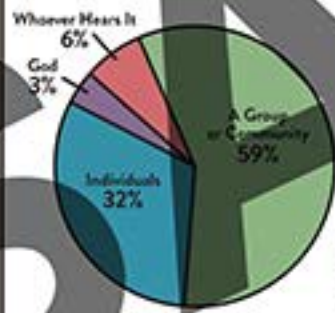
or be afraid, worried, or alarmed.

How to Say It!

Most Common Sayings:

do not be afraid
do not fear
do not be afraid of
do not worry
have no fear
sh't' not/will not fear

Some Unique Ways to Say It:

do not be in dread
the cores of my heart
banish anxiety
do not be alarmed
do not be anxious
whom shall I fear

Most Comprehensive Verse:

"Do not lose heart or be afraid or panic or be in dread of them."
—Deuteronomy 20:3b

Power Pair:

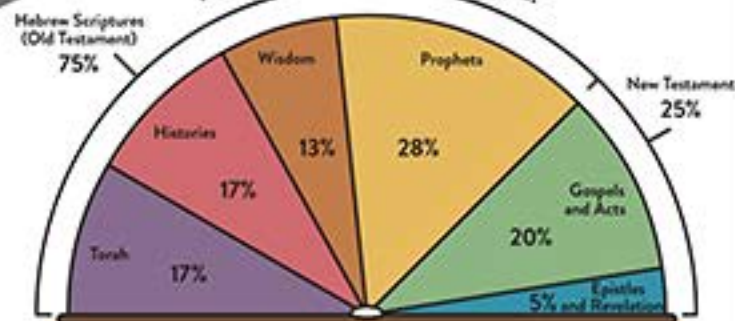
"Do not fear or be dismayed" occurs more than thirteen times in the Hebrew Scriptures.



73% of Hebrew Scripture passages include a form of the Hebrew word for "fear," *yare'* (יָרָא).

76% of the New Testament verses include a form of the Greek word for "fear," *phobos* (φόβος).

Where Can You Find These Passages?



13% of these passages are found in Isaiah! The most of any single book in the Bible.
